Background



The Commission on Social Determinants of Health

 has called on the World Health Organisation (WHO) and all governments to lead global action on the social determinants of health with the aim of achieving health equity.

For Governments

- need to have settingspecific, timely and relevant evidence on the relationship between determinants and outcomes.
- Such information is limited, especially in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs).
- calls for more research on social determinants of health and demands capacity-building activities to enable such research.

INTREC - INDEPTH Training and Research Centres of Excellence

- is envisioned to address health inequities in LMICs of Africa and Asia by:
- 1. Developing sustainable capacity for research for health and its social determinants, and
- 2. Facilitating translation of research findings into policy and practice in both regions.

Informing policies and action

- Evidence:
 - to inform policies
 - to hold governments accountable
 - 1. Ask the "right" questions
 - 2. Collect data (timely, region-specific)
 - 3. Communicate evidence
- Capacity
 - Education of researchers
 - Education of decision-makers

- Involving decision-makers and other stakeholder in INTREC activities

 - Translation of research into policy and practice

After EC Contribution

- INTREC succesful approach to to building sustainable capacity:
 - Further development of INTREC centres
 - Expand to other countries

First Step: Develop INTREC Social Scientists (ISS)

Some of the tasks:

- Conduct a review of the epidemiological and public health situation in their own country
- Identify and summarise all relevant country policies regarding the social determinants of health, including dates for, and key actors in any likely policy reviews
- Identify and summarise all relevant curricula regarding the social determinants of health in institutions of post-graduate education in the country
